We want to salute Barbara Criss, a Trustee on the Old Forge Library Board since 1992, and a member of the Mid-York Library System Board of Trustees for the past seven years. She has served on numerous committees for Mid-York which is headquartered in Utica. She is currently a member of the Planning Committee and she has been Chairperson of the Finance Committee for the past five years. She also served as Vice President on the Mid-York Library System Board for one term.

Mid-York Library System provides services to 43 libraries in Herkimer, Madison and Oneida counties which includes interlibrary loans between the libraries, ordering and processing new books, and maintaining a telecommunications network to member libraries. "It's been a worthwhile experience to be part of this. I've met some great people," Barbara said.

She is still an active member of the Old Forge Library Board of Trustees, having served as Treasurer for a number of years before serving as president for three terms. She is manager of Community Bank in Old Forge and a member of the Central Adirondack Association's Board of Directors. She and her husband Doug live in Old Forge with their son Colin, a 9th grader at the Town of Webb School, and daughter Alicia, who is in Graduate School at Maxwell School of Syracuse University working towards a Masters degree in Public Administration.

So with these few words I suggest that if you want to know the heart, the spirit of all here that's best this is a place where you might start, a place where you might start.


