

Children's Environmental Workshops

On Sat. July 2 from 11:15-noon a "Birdfeeders from Milk Cartons" Workshop will be held at the Library. Led by intern Diane Mulvihill, it is for Children K-4 Grade. This workshop introduces students to a new way of reusing old trash to make something useful from nature. Children should bring a plastic gallon jug if they can. Registration for the workshop is appreciated but walk-ins are welcome. Diane is planning five more Environmental Workshops for Kids on July 30 and August 6, 11, 13, and 25.

*Up North

The Library will host Dick Case, author of "Up North" on Tuesday July 12 at 7:30 pm. He is a columnist for the *Syracuse Post Standard* and he knows his territory well. He will share the anecdotal stories of the area north of Syracuse, NY including the Tug Hill Plateau and the Adirondacks. Books will be available for purchase and author signing.

*Old Forge and the Fulton Chain

Linda Cohen and Peg Masters, co-authors of "Old Forge and the Fulton Chain of Lakes," will give a presentation at the Old Forge Library on July 19 at 7:30 pm. The book contains more than 200 historic photographs of the area with their descriptions. Peg is the Town of Webb Historian and Linda is a longtime resident. There will be books available to purchase and signed by the authors.

@ Adirondack Storytelling and Music Festival

You won't want to miss this year's Festival which will be held on July 24 from 12-2 pm under the tent on the Forge Motel Knoll. We hope you enjoy the change in venue to the center of the village. The Festival's Emcee will be Joe Bruchac. Performing from 12-12:35 will be popular Adirondack Storyteller and Balladeer Bill Smith, a local favorite. Susan Trump will perform from 12:40-1:15pm. Her songs touch the heart, recall the past, and inspire the times ahead. Rounding out this year's cast of performers is Joe Bruchac who will perform with his son, Jesse from 1:20-2pm. Storyteller and author, Joe draws much of his inspiration from his Abenaki ancestry. Jesse Bruchac has worked exten-

sively over the last 15 years in projects involving the preservation of the Abenaki language, storytelling, music and traditional culture. Local Native American Artist Andree Dennis Newton will also be on hand demonstrating Abenaki Wood Carving, an art that she inherited from her father. There will be CDs, books and handcrafted articles for sale during the festival.

*The Roads to Publication: How to Reach the Promised Land

This workshop led by Robert Hershon will be held from 9:30-11:30 am on Tuesday, July 26. He is the coeditor of Hanging Loose Press, one of the country's oldest independent publishers. On Tuesday, July 26 at 7:30 pm the Library invites you to enjoy an evening of traditional acoustic music performed by Ray and John Delaney of the Delaney Brothers Bluegrass. Born into a musical family in Newark, New Jersey, Ray Delaney started playing the guitar at age 14. After relocating to Central New York in 1960, he, along with his brother John, began singing as a duo, mostly pop and contemporary folk songs. Their music has received favorable reviews by music critics and they are known for tight vocals and new and different instrumental arrangements.

*Climate Whiplash: What Happens After Global Warming?

Tues. Aug 2 at 7:30 pm a PowerPoint presentation will be given by Curt Stager who asks us this thought provoking question. He argues that our fossil fuel emissions will interfere with climates for much longer than most of us realize. Stager is a paleoecologist, educator, and science journalist whose research for the last three decades has dealt with the climatic history of the Adirondacks, Peru, and Africa.
