Happy New Year to you all - and our best wishes for a more prosperous 2009.



\$Friends Annual Luncheon

**The Together Book Talk for Kids and Parents

This program offers a forum for parents and their 9 to 11-year-old children to join together at the library to discuss books and share ideas. Studies have shown that children in that age group often begin losing interest in reading for fun, and the involvement of parents in their children's reading has a strong impact on their future reading habits. The program was developed and is funded by the New York Council for the Humanities and is supported by the We the People initiative of the National Endowment for the Humanities. The program is coordinated and will be hosted by Old Forge Library director, Isabella Worthen. The co-facilitators are published poet and teacher Paula Roy of Thendara and

Books, snacks, and activities for younger siblings will be provided at each session. 

Prizes will be awarded and the winners announced to the public at the Opening Exhibit that will include all of the entries on Tuesday, March 24, at 7 p.m. Participants whose poems and illustrations win or receive Honorable Mention in their divisions will have an opportunity to read and/or display and discuss their work. Following the presentations, a reception will be hosted by the Friends of the Old Forge Library. The

Parents as Reading Partners
