David Oster is a self-taught Illustrator who is known among friends as 'RC', due to his love of roller coasters. Years ago, he was employed by a company that built wooden coasters, and he still draws them from time to time. But he is mostly known for his highlydetailed renderings of local landmarks, specifically barns and old homes. His drawings are created in ink and often are tinted with colored pencils. His work encompasses farms and townscapes and mills from the Southern Tier to the Tug Hill. Oster also does pencil sketches of nature scenes and a few scenes near Raquette Lake and Old Forge will be on display as well.
