The Kick-off and Registration was held Thursday, July 2. The program continues each Thursday until July 30, from 12 noon to 1 p.m. with a variety of activities for children Pre-K and up. The theme of the Kick-off program on July 2, was, "Join Your Team's Kazoo Band" with Maureen Van Slyke as conductor, accompanying. +^Adirondack Storytelling Festival

The Annual Adirondack Storytelling Festival, a day of Traditional Folklore, Music and Craft Demonstrations for the whole family, will be held in McCauley Mountain Chalet on Saturday, July 25, from 10 am to 4 pm. Food and beverages will be available all day. Festivities begin with a Nature Walk led by Bruce Conde from 10 to 11 a.m. A Storytelling Workshop will be led by Storyteller Jeannine Laverty from 11 a.m. to Noon. Craft Demonstrations will be featured by skilled craftspeople from 11 am to 4 pm, and books, CDs and crafts will be on sale. The Town of Webb Historical Association will feature their Exhibit, "Camp Memories - Youth Camps." Children's activities will be held from 1 to 3 pm. The Storytelling begins at 12 noon, when the Emcee, Joe Bruchac, international author and professional native American storyteller, introduces songsmith Dan Berggren, who will play guitar and sing Adirondack songs. At 12:50 pm, Jeannine Laverty, who won the 1999 Northeast Region Award for Leadership from the National Storytelling Network, will tell Adirondack stories. At 1:30 p.m the versatile folk duo of John Kirk & Trish Miller from Saratoga County will entertain with lively fiddle tunes and fancy footwork. At 2:30 p.m, Emcee Joe Bruchac and his son Jesse, a drummer, whose specialty is the native flute, will be on deck to entertain with Abenaki and Iroquois stories and Indian music. At 3:15 p.m. Bill Smith, well known Adirondack storyteller and basket maker, will entertain with Adirondack tall tales and stories passed down to him by his father, a woodsman and logger, and old ballads once popular among local folks in the North Country. Admission price is \$5. Youngsters 16 and under are free.

Artists Series & Exhibitions July

The July Photography Exhibit by Adirondack photographer, Mark Bowie, entitled, In Stoddard's Footsteps: The Adirondacks Then and Now, is also the title of his award winning book. The Exhibit is now on view in the Judith Lowenstein Cohen Memorial Wing of the library. The Opening Reception was held Monday, June 29. Bowie followed in the footsteps of late 19th Century pioneer Adirondack wilderness photographer Seneca Ray Stoddard to re-photograph some of Stoddard's images for his book. The Stoddard and Bowie photographs are exhibited together for comparison. "The comparisons are fascinating, sometimes surprising, and in every case, illuminating," Bowie said. The exhibit will be on view until Tuesday, July 21, when Bowie will give a **Power Point presentation of his book, "In Stoddard's Footsteps," at 7:30 p.m. A reception and booksigning will follow the program.

The August Art Exhibit, "Up Old Forge Way," by artist Gordon Bashant Opens on Friday, August 7, with a Reception from 4-6 p.m. Bashant, a retired surgeon from Utica and now a resident of San Diego, began painting 15 years ago after taking watercolor classes at Munson Williams Proctor Institute in Utica. He has continued his studies since moving to San Diego. He works primarily in transparent watercolor and also works in acrylics and mixed media. His style is expressionistic but is based on realism. He distorts by both line and color to acquire his unique style. His work has been exhibited in various National Shows and he has received numerous honors and awards. His paintings will be on view in the library wing through the month of August.

**Scherelene Schatz, author of The Adirondacks, a Postcard History, presented a Power Point talk about her book at the Old Forge Library on Thursday, July 2, at 7:30 p.m. Her personal collection of postcards offered a glimpse of the Adirondacks in the early 20th century. A reception with refreshments followed her presentation.

**Gary Lee, retired forest ranger, and Weekly Adirondack columnist, will give a Power Point presentation on Tuesday, July 14. He recently the published book, "Adirondack Birding", with co-author John M. C. Peterson. Lee will talk about his birding adventures and the best areas in the Adirondacks to find the bird species of most interest to birders. The program begins at 7:30 p.m.
