This holiday season there were 31 books donated through the library's Evergreen Tree Wish List program. The Board of Trustees and the staff wish to thank all our generous patrons and friends who donated a total of \$461.24 to this program.

The Elf Express

The co-sponsor, Adirondack Scenic Railroad, furnished eight cars that were quickly filled with 520 children, parents and friends who traveled from Thendara Station to Otter Lake and back. Gwen Tracy entertained with Christmas songs, Kiwanis Key Club volunteers read The Polar Bear Express, conducted games, and passed out Candy Canes and Hershey's Kisses, while Jingle Belle (Izzie Worthen) and Snowflake (Bev Meeker) kept everything running smoothly. There was no charge for children but donations were accepted from the other passengers. After expenses, this annual fundraiser event cleared \$763.45. All proceeds will benefit the Adirondack Storytelling Festival at McCauley Mountain in July 2008.


New members are always welcome to join the book discussion groups. Copies of the books can be reserved by calling the library at 369-6008.


